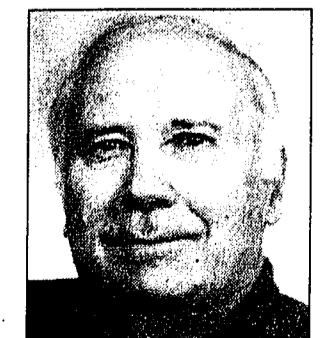

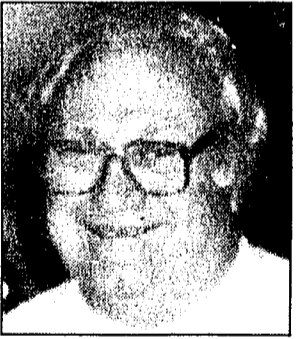

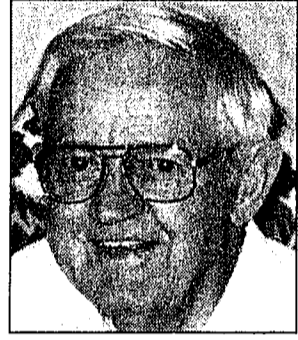
**Eldred, Stephen E.**
