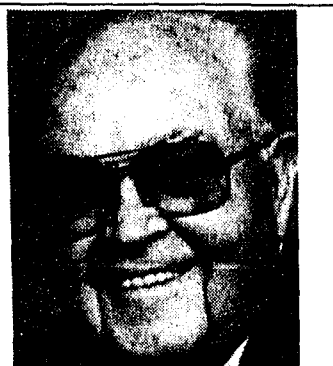
Wettstein, Howard R. Sr.
