

History haunting firm that proposes dog track

KAUKAUNA (AP) — Delaware North officials say they may have to combat a perception that their corporate predecessor was tainted by organized crime, but they are prepared to defend the company against any accusations.

The Buffalo, N.Y. firm, which has proposed a greyhound race track here, has acknowledged that Emprise, a subsidiary of Sportsystems Corp. and a predecessor to Delaware North, was convicted in 1972 of one count of conspiracy and fined \$10,000.

Delaware North officials said the incident is not indicative of current business practices, but they fear opponents of the proposed \$15-million pari-mutuel race track at Highways 41 and 55 may make it a referendum issue.

"We are not in a position to hide any of it," said Delaware North spokesman Mark Goff. "We welcome any level of investigation into this company."

Goff said information about the company and its history would be supplied to the State Racing Board.

Kaukauna Mayor Ronald Van De Hey also downplayed the 1972 incident and stressed that Delaware North is a clean operation.

"I don't have a concern," he said.

"We're talking about a predecessor to the existing corporation and an event that supposedly took place over 20 years ago. The matter was put to rest."

The conviction stemmed from three loans authorized in 1966 and 1967 by former Emprise Chief Executive Officer Louis Jacobs. Authorities alleged the loans were part of a conspiracy to acquire hidden financial interests in a Las Vegas casino.

Emprise was charged with lending money to men who were later identified as members of organized crime.

Goff said as the competition to obtain racing licenses increases, competitors will use black marks like the conviction to try to improve their own chances.

"Our competitors will distribute tons of information, some of which is absolutely fictitious," he said. "We are in a position to defend virtually anything that comes up."

Goff said Delaware North's detractors have also tried to link Emprise with the 1976 murder of Don Bolles, a reporter for the Arizona Republic who died when a bomb exploded beneath his car in a Phoenix parking lot.

Witnesses reportedly heard Bolles mumble "Emprise" before an ambulance arrived, Goff said.

In an April 15 letter to the Fort Worth Star-Telegram, Delaware North Vice President Stanley Phillips said the Bolles matter "is yet another situation where innuendo has prevailed over fact."

"In the wake of Don Bolles' death, some 35 investigating reporters spent months in the state and did not find a single link to Emprise," Phillips wrote.

Delaware North, an international holding company, deals in food services, metals processing, pari-mutuel operations, parking management, typography and publishing. Annual operating revenues exceed \$1 billion and the company employs about 43,000 worldwide.

It provides food and beverage concessions for several professional sports teams, including the Milwaukee Brewers. The Jacobs family owns the National Hockey League's Boston Bruins and the Boston Garden, home of the Boston Celtics of the National Basketball Association.

A company statement said while the Emprise conviction is an "undisputed event in the corporate history of Delaware North," the incident "has been resurrected in the media or by self-interested competitors vying with Delaware North for business."

Louis Jacobs died in 1968. Two

years later, Emprise was merged out of existence and a new corporation, also called Emprise Corp., survived the merger.

Three years after Jacobs' death, the loans he had authorized resulted in a 10-count indictment against the old Emprise, which was later dismissed in 1971 when a one-count in-

dictment was filed against the company's successor.

Delaware North said no individuals associated with either Emprise corporation were charged.

"There was no charge that 'old' Emprise hatched a criminal plot, or sought to aid a criminal conspiracy," the company said. "Its only mistake

was that it loaned money to individuals, some of whom were later identified as members of organized crime, who invested in the frontier."

The owners and managers of the new Emprise were not the same individuals involved with the predecessors, Delaware North said.

Goyke admits role in hotel arrangements

MILWAUKEE (AP) — Lobbyist Gary Goyke said Sunday he had a role in providing hotel arrangements for a legislator but was unsure whether office files actually show he paid for the room.

Goyke said office files he accuses a former employee of stealing probably "indicated that it was my intent to pay for that through my office."

State law forbids public officials from accepting anything of value from a registered lobbyist, or for a lobbyist to give anything of value.

Sen. Jerome Van Sistine, D-Green Bay, was among legislators disclosing last week that Goyke had done them favors but denied there was any influence peddling.

Van Sistine said he was given a hotel room in Los Angeles two years ago as a honeymoon gift.

While the gift card was signed by Goyke's wife Nancy, it is possible the room was rented with Goyke's credit card, Goyke said.

The fact he asked the hotel to send the reservation confirmation to his Madison home does not mean it was a business transaction, he said.

"There is nothing wrong with making arrangements," he said.

Goyke said he was unsure whether his credit card was involved and did not know to which account the gift might have been billed.

He tried unsuccessfully last week to call a Milwaukee court to halt pub-

lication of an article containing what he calls information in the files taken by Brenda Gail Shiman, whom he fired in November.

Shiman, now of Chicago, said she copied files as a precaution against being blamed for what she called illegalities in Goyke's dealings.

Asked whether the missing files contain evidence of the hotel transaction, Goyke replied that Shiman "may have been involved in the payment, I'm not sure."

"She obviously was alleging, in the documents she provided (the magazine article's author), that it was not done correctly," he said.

Van Sistine has said he presumes the honeymoon gift came from Goyke's wife and sons.
