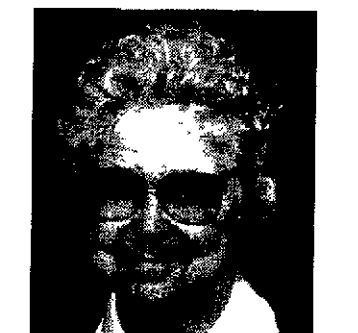
Callin, James R.
